The focus of this study is to understand the sentiment of Malaysians towards Covid-19 Vaccine.

The research objectives of this study are to:



Likelihood of getting vaccinated (self pay vs government funded)



• Attitude and perception towards vaccines in general with a focus on Covid-19 vaccine.



Key sources of information on Covid-19 vaccine



• Awareness and perception of different vaccine manufactures

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY



This report is based on a sample of 4,500 Malaysian adults stratified to represent the Malaysian adult population profile. The data was gathered via online publisher websites across Vodus Media Network that consists of Media Prima, Astro, Star Media Group.

This is an online methodology which uses low disruption <u>OMTOS</u> survey method pioneered by Vodus.

The fieldwork was done during 27th January to 7th February 2021.

The target group for this study is as follows:

- Adult Malaysians (over the age of 18 years)
- Peninsular and East Malaysia


DATA TREATMENT: POST-STRATIFICATION

To ensure that our sample is demographically representative of the Malaysian population (without demographic bias), post-stratification data treatment is applied to our sample.

Post-stratification is applied by adding weights to each demographic characteristics in our sample to ensure that our resulting sample is reflective of the Malaysian population census.

Our sample is post-stratified according to the following demographics: Age, Gender, Race and State.







Detailed Findings

Vaccination among Adult Malaysians

Only about 1/3rd of adult Malaysians recall being vaccinated for other diseases. Younger age group and professionals or those belonging to senior leadership recall more than others. Out of those with Children, more than half recall vaccinating their children. Higher income group and white-collar workforce recall getting their children vaccinated more than others




What do Malaysians think of Covid-19 vaccines?



- Malaysians generally believe that vaccines are an effective way to prevent disease.
- They perceive Covid-19 as dangerous, and life threatening.
- They also believe that the Covid-19 vaccine will be effective in controlling the disease.
- Only 1 in 10 Malaysians have a negative opinion about the Covid-19 vaccine.
- Most are optimistic that it will end the pandemic and is safe.
- A large majority also agrees that more testing is needed to establish its safety and efficacy.

Are Malaysians willing to get vaccinated?




Impact of Opinion of the disease, vaccine and prior vaccination on the Likelihood to get vaccinated





- Those who recall vaccinating their children for other diseases are much more likely to vaccinate them for Covid-19 than those who don't recall.
- Furthermore, the 'perception of Covid-19 as a life-threatening disease' has no impact on their willingness to get their children vaccinated.
- Those who have a positive opinion about the vaccine are much more likely to get vaccinated.

Sources of Information








% of Respondents with Positive Opinion

- Majority of respondents perceive government as a trustworthy source of information, followed by the medical community and scientific data.
- Social media and hearsay from family and friends is not considered a trustworthy source of information by most.
- Government has the most positive impact on the people's overall opinion towards Covid-19 vaccine.

Awareness and Perception of Vaccine manufacturer among Malaysians



- Most respondents are aware of Pfizer. This may be due to it having the first mover advantage.
- Low awareness is seen for others such as AstraZeneca, SinoVac, Moderna.

• Pfizer is the most trusted vaccine manufacturer among the Malaysians without any close competitors.
